Date to stop the	ese medications:	
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If you are taking any of the following medications:

- Plavix: stop 7 days prior to procedure
- Aspirin: stop 7 days prior to procedure
- Warfarin/Coumadin: stop 5 days prior to procedure
- Prasugrel/Effient: stop 7 days prior to procedure
- Apixaban/Eliquis: stop 3 days prior to procedure
- Dabigatran/Pradaxa: stop 3 days prior to procedure
- Rivaroxaban/Xarelto: stop 3 days prior to procedure
- Phentermine/Adipex-p/Lomaira: stop 7 days prior to procedure
- Aggrenox: stop 7 days prior to procedure
- Please let us know if you are taking any **OVER THE COUNTER DRUGS OR SUPPLEMENTS** of any kind.
- Please inform us of any and all ALLERGIES you have, including LATEX allergies.
- If you are taking GLUCOPHAGE/METFORMIN it MUST BE DISCONTINUED 48 hours prior to any SURGERY requiring anesthesia.
